Happy 2021!

Prior to the Holiday Break, the Quebec government announced an extension to the opening of schools in the new year: January 11th. Barring any other announcements, OES will be welcoming students back to the school on **Monday**, **11 January**.

School winter activities:

Cross-country skiing: The Pontiac Community Gym received a grant from Loisir Sport Outaouais (Outdoors grant) with the Ministry of Education and Higher Education of Quebec to buy cross-country ski equipment. But, due to COVID 19, the gym was closed and the gym managers opted to *lend* OES the gear (winter 2021) for the students to enjoy. We are looking forward to groomed trails or the opportunity to make some trails locally.

Building a Snow Castle with Marc Walter: January 19-22

Marc Walter is an artist who will be coming in to work with all the students in the school in creating one big snow castle. OES will take steps to maintain appropriate social distancing (Marc Walter will provide some key instructions by video conferencing and maintain social distancing while working outside at the school). He will lead us in filling wooden moulds to create the blocks, which we will then carve into the structures surrounding our school castle. Your child will be outside for an extra hour each of these days. Please send your child with warm outdoor clothing and extra mittens, socks and pants. Extended Planning and Training Days:

At OES, we have <u>one planning and training</u> day remaining: **18 January**. If there is a delay or cancellation of the *planning and training* day above, we'll follow-up on 17 February (only *if* necessary). In November, the <u>MEQ</u> announced that teachers will have extra days for training in distance education in the event that schools and/or classes are closed again due to the spread of COVID 19.

Preparing for colder weather: With the colder weather here to stay, teachers and staff are asking parents to ensure that our students are dressed appropriately. At OES we are encouraging the younger students in K4, K5 and Grade 1 to be as independent as possible with getting dressed to go outside: Our goal is to have as many students as possible able to dress themselves. Keeping the little ones dry: If you have a child in K4, K5 and Grades 1 / 2, it is important to make sure we have a change of clothes on hand here at OES: pants, socks, underwear as needed. The older grades should also have an extra pair of mittens and socks to keep in their lockers as well.
