

Tutorials for parents: Teams, Sway, PowerPoint Live and FlipGrid

Teams

Allows multiple means of communication and learning activities. Teachers can create assignments and evaluate them. Classes have video conference capacity and teachers can have 1:1 meetings with students as needs. Take a look at the top 10 features of Teams

Sway

The power of sway allows a student to create a series of cards which can be mixed and matched or recombined for an interesting storyline. The content can include links to information supporting websites, videos, images and narratives (voice overs). Here is a good starting point <u>tutorial for Sway</u>. PowerPoint LIVE

Creating a PowerPoint deck is common but the "Live" feature is relatively new in 2020. Teachers can allow students to <u>respond to online presentations</u> in "real time": that is to say, while the teacher presents at a scheduled time, the students can respond and ask questions at the same time. For parents, it may be important to see how students can produce a PowerPoint deck and go live with one of their classes.

FlipGrid

This application allows students to respond to teachers with video commentary. It is useful because it does not have to be a "real time" activity. Students can complete an on-line assignment and <u>post a</u> response that capturess their authentic ideas. Using FlipGrid becomes easier with practice and frequency.
